Adams Museum:

Explore Deadwood's past and discover the unique history of the Black Hills. See a 95 million year-old plesiosaur fossil, come face-to-face with a five-ton locomotive, and engage in a variety of interactive activities including an augmented reality sandbox.

Days of '76 Museum:

See more than 50 animal-powered vehicles, learn about the history of the Days of '76 celebration and rodeo, and view an impressive collection of pioneer and American Indian artifacts.

Historic Adams House:

Experience the beauty and history of the meticulously restored 1892 Victorian home, complete with original contents and real-life stories of two of Deadwood's founding families.
